MIXED USE SCHEMES

1 Noise

An owner or occupier of a lot must not create any noise on a lot or the property likely to interfere with the peaceful enjoyment of the owner or occupier of another lot or of any person lawfully using common property.

2 Vehicles

(1) An owner or occupier of a lot must not park or stand any motor or other vehicle on common property or permit any invitees of the owner or occupier to park or stand any motor or other vehicle on common property except with the prior written approval of the owners corporation.

(2) The owners corporation must not unreasonably withhold its approval to the parking or standing of a motor vehicle on the common property.

3 Obstruction of common property

An owner or occupier of a lot must not obstruct lawful use of common property by any person except on a temporary and non-recurring basis.

4 Damage to lawns and plants on common property

An owner or occupier of a lot must not, except with the prior written approval of the owners corporation:

(a) damage any lawn, garden, tree, shrub, plant or flower being part of or situated on common property, or

(b) use for his or her own purposes as a garden any portion of the common property.

5 Damage to common property

(1) An owner or occupier of a lot must not mark, paint, drive nails or screws or the like into, or otherwise damage or deface, any structure that forms part of the common property except with the written approval of the owners corporation.

(2) An approval given by the owners corporation under subclause (1) cannot authorise any additions to the common property.

(3) This by-law does not prevent an owner or person authorised by an owner from installing:

(a) any locking or other safety device for protection of the owner's lot against intruders or to improve safety within the owner's lot, or

(b) any screen or other device to prevent entry of animals or insects on the lot, or

(c) any structure or device to prevent harm to children, or

(d) any sign to advertise the activities of the occupier of the lot if the owners corporation has specified locations for such signs and that sign is installed in the specified locations, or

(e) any device used to affix decorative items to the internal surfaces of walls in the owner's lot.



(4) Any such locking or safety device, screen, other device or structure must be installed in a competent and proper manner and must have an appearance, after it has been installed, in keeping with the appearance of the rest of the building.

(5) Despite section 62, the owner of a lot must:

(a) maintain and keep in a state of good and serviceable repair any installation or structure referred to in subclause (3) that forms part of the common property and that services the lot, and

(b) repair any damage caused to any part of the common property by the installation or removal of any locking or safety device, screen, other device or structure referred to in subclause (3) that forms part of the common property and that services the lot.

6 Behaviour of owners and occupiers

An owner or occupier of a lot when on common property must be adequately clothed and must not use language or behave in a manner likely to cause offence or embarrassment to the owner or occupier of another lot or to any person lawfully using common property.

7 Children playing on common property in building

An owner or occupier of a lot must not permit any child of whom the owner or occupier has control to play on common property within the building or, unless accompanied by an adult exercising effective control, to be or to remain on common property comprising a laundry, car parking area or other area of possible danger or hazard to children.

8 Behaviour of invitees

An owner or occupier of a lot must take all reasonable steps to ensure that invitees of the owner or occupier do not behave in a manner likely to interfere with the peaceful enjoyment of the owner or occupier of another lot or any person lawfully using common property.

9 Depositing rubbish and other material on common property

An owner or occupier of a lot must not deposit or throw on the common property any rubbish, dirt, dust or other material or discarded item except with the prior written approval of the owners corporation.

10 Drying of laundry items

An owner or occupier of a lot must not, except with the prior written approval of the owners corporation, hang any washing, towel, bedding, clothing or other article on any part of the parcel in such a way as to be visible from outside the building other than on any lines provided by the owners corporation for the purpose and there only for a reasonable period.

11 Cleaning windows and doors

An owner or occupier of a lot must keep clean all exterior surfaces of glass in windows and doors on the boundary of the lot, including so much as is common property, unless:

(a) the owners corporation resolves that it will keep the glass or specified part of the glass clean, or

(b) that glass or part of the glass cannot be accessed by the owner or occupier of the lot safely or at all.

12 Storage of Inflammable liquids and other substances and materials

(1) An owner or occupier of a lot must not, except with the prior written approval of the owners corporation, use or store on the lot or on the common property any inflammable chemical, liquid or gas or other inflammable material.

(2) This by-law does not apply to chemicals, liquids, gases or other material used or intended to be used for domestic purposes, or any chemical, liquid, gas or other material in a fuel tank of a motor vehicle or internal combustion engine.

13 Moving furniture and other objects on or through common property

(1) An owner or occupier of a lot must not transport any furniture, large object or deliveries to or from the lot through or on common property within the building unless sufficient notice has first been given to the executive committee so as to enable the executive committee to arrange for its nominee to be present at the time when the owner or occupier does so.

(2) An owners corporation may resolve that furniture, large objects or deliveries to and from the lot are to be transported through or on the common property (whether in the building or not) in a specified manner.

(3) If the owners corporation has specified, by resolution, the manner in which furniture, large objects or deliveries to and from the lot are to be transported, then an owner or occupier of a lot must not transport any furniture, large object or deliveries to and from the lot through or on common property except in accordance with that resolution.

14 Floor coverings

(1) An owner of a lot must ensure that all floor space within the lot is covered or otherwise treated to an extent sufficient to prevent the transmission from the floor space of noise likely to disturb the peaceful enjoyment of the owner or occupier of another lot.

(2) This by-law does not apply to floor space comprising a kitchen, laundry, lavatory or bathroom.

15 Garbage disposal

(1) An owner or occupier of a lot in a strata scheme that does not have shared receptacles for garbage, recyclable material or waste:

(a) must maintain such receptacles within the lot, or on such part of the common property as may be authorised by the owners corporation, in clean and dry condition and (except in the case of receptacles for recyclable material) adequately covered, and

(b) must ensure that before refuse, recyclable material or waste is placed in the receptacles it is, in the case of refuse, securely wrapped or, in the case of tins or other containers, completely drained, or, in the case of recyclable material or waste, separated and prepared in accordance with the applicable recycling guidelines, and

(c) for the purpose of having the garbage, recyclable material or waste collected, must place the receptacles within an area designated for that purpose by the owners corporation and at a time not more than 12 hours

before the time at which garbage, recyclable material or waste is normally collected, and

(d) when the garbage, recyclable material or waste has been collected, must promptly return the receptacles to the lot or other area referred to in paragraph (a),

(e) must not place any thing in the receptacles of the owner or occupier of any other lot except with the permission of that owner or occupier, and

(f) must promptly remove any thing which the owner, occupier or garbage or recycling collector may have spilled from the receptacles and must take such action as may be necessary to clean the area within which that thing was spilled.

(2) Subclause (1) does not require an owner or occupier of a lot to dispose of any chemical, biological, toxic or other hazardous waste in a manner that would contravene any relevant law applying to the disposal of such waste.

(3) An owner or occupier of a lot in a strata scheme that has shared receptacles for garbage, recyclable material or waste:

(a) must ensure that before refuse, recyclable material or waste is placed in the receptacles it is, in the case of refuse, securely wrapped or, in the case of tins or other containers, completely drained, or, in the case of recyclable material or waste, separated and prepared in accordance with the applicable recycling guidelines, and

(b) must promptly remove any thing which the owner, occupier or garbage or recycling collector may have spilled in the area of the receptacles and must take such action as may be necessary to clean the area within which that thing was spilled.

(4) Subclause (3) does not require an owner or occupier of a lot to dispose of any chemical, biological, toxic or other hazardous waste in a manner that would contravene any relevant law applying to the disposal of such waste.

16 Keeping of animals

Subject to section 49 (4), an owner or occupier of a residential lot must not keep any animal on the lot or the common property.

17 Appearance of lot

(1) The owner or occupier of a lot must not, except with the prior written approval of the owners corporation, maintain within the lot anything visible from outside the lot that, viewed from outside the lot, is not in keeping with the rest of the building.

(2) This by-law does not apply to the hanging of any washing, towel, bedding, clothing or other article as referred to in by-law 10.

18 Change in use of lot to be notified

An occupier of a lot must notify the owners corporation if the occupier changes the existing use of the lot in a way that may affect the insurance premiums for the strata scheme (for example, if the change of use results in a hazardous activity being carried out

on the lot, or results in the lot being used for commercial or industrial purposes rather than residential purposes).

19 Preservation of fire safety

The owner or occupier of a lot must not do any thing or permit any invitees of the owner or occupier to do any thing on the lot or common property that is likely to affect the operation of fire safety devices in the parcel or to reduce the level of fire safety in the lots or common property.

20 Prevention of hazards

The owner or occupier of a lot must not do any thing or permit any invitees of the owner or occupier to do any thing on the lot or common property that is likely to create a hazard or danger to the owner or occupier of another lot or any person lawfully using the common property.

21 Provision of amenities or services

(1) The owners corporation may, by special resolution, determine to enter into arrangements for the provision of the following amenities or services to one or more of the lots, or to the owners or occupiers of one or more of the lots:

- (a) security services,
- (b) promotional services,
- (c) advertising,
- (d) commercial cleaning,
- (e) domestic services,
- (f) garbage disposal and recycling services,
- (g) electricity, water or gas supply,
- (h) telecommunication services (for example, cable television).

(2) If the owners corporation makes a resolution referred to in subclause (1) to provide an amenity or service to a lot or to the owner or occupier of a lot, it must indicate in the resolution the amount for which, or the conditions on which, it will provide the amenity or service.

Note. Section 111 of the Act provides that an owners corporation may enter into an agreement with an owner or occupier of a lot for the provision of amenities or services by it to the lot or to the owner or occupier.

22 Controls on hours of operation and use of facilities

(1) The owners corporation may, by special resolution, make any of the following determinations if it considers the determination is appropriate for the control, management, administration, use or enjoyment of the lots or the lots and common property of the strata scheme:

- (a) that commercial or business activities may be conducted on a lot or common property only during certain times,
- (b) that facilities situated on the common property may be used only during certain times or on certain conditions.

(2) An owner or occupier of a lot must comply with a determination referred to in subclause (1).

23 Differential contributions for insurance

If the use to which a lot is put causes an insurance premium for the strata scheme to be greater than it otherwise would be if it were not put to that use then unless charged directly to the owner or user of the lot by the insurer the owner of that lot shall be liable for the extra premium (or loading or however such additional premium is described) and the contributions levied upon and payable by the owner of any such lot may be increased to reflect the extra premium. Where the use to which one or more lots are put together cause such extra premium the the contributions levied upon and payable by the owners of such lots shall be increased in proportion to their respective unit entitlements.

24 Differential contributions - general

Where a charge or expense incurred by the owners corporation is solely attributable to facilities forming part of the common property which are used exclusively by or in relation to a lot or lots used for retail or commercial activities then the owner or owners of such lot or lots shall be liable for that charge or expense and the contributions levied upon and payable by the owner or owners of such lot or lots may be increased by the amount of that charge or expense and where there are more than one such lot the contributions levied upon and payable by the owners of such lots shall be increased in proportion to their respective unit entitlements. Such differential contributions may be levied in accordance with this by law in relation to charges or expenses (but are not limited to such charges or expenses) for the following:-

- cleaning of toilets/washrooms or other cleaning
- cleaning maintenance and servicing of grease trap (or like device)

If the use to which a lot or lots is put causes a charge or expense payable by the owners corporation to be greater than it otherwise would be if the lot or lots were not put to that use (whether or not attributable to or in connection with facilities forming part of the common property) then unless charged directly to the owner or occupier of the lot or lots by the Authority or other person or entity making the charge or requiring payment of the expense then the owner of that lot or lots shall be liable for the extra charge or expense (however described) and the contributions levied upon and payable by the owner of any such lot or lots may be increased to reflect the extra charge or expense and or by the amount of the extra charge or expense. Where the use to which one or more lots are put together cause such extra charge or expense the contributions levied upon and payable by the owners of such lots shall be increased in proportion to their respective unit entitlements. Such differential contributions may be levied in accordance with this by law in relation to charges (but are not limited to such charges) for the following:-

- cleaning of toilets/washrooms or other cleaning
- cleaning maintenance and servicing of grease trap (or like device)

25 Signage

(1) The owner or occupier of a lot must not erect affix or place any sign signs signage or advertising material on the common property including but not limited to the outside wall

window or other surface of any lot or shopfront without the prior written approval of the owners corporation.

- (2) The owners corporation must not unreasonably withhold its approval to signs and other things referred to in subclause (1) hereof provided such signs or things are on and within the shopfront of lots lawfully used for retail or commercial purposes but may in any such case impose such terms and conditions as it deems fit. The owners corporation may otherwise in its absolute discretion withhold or arbitrarily refuse consent to any signs and other things referred to in subclause (1) or impose such terms and conditions as it deems fit.
- (3) The owner or occupier of a lot lawfully used for retail or commercial purposes must not maintain within the lot including but not limited to the area inside the shopfront of any such lot any sign signs or advertising material or other thing which viewed from outside the lot is not in keeping with the rest of the building or with the high quality and or high-class retail and commercial use of the non residential part of the building or which is offensive to the owners or occupiers of the building or to members of the public.

26 Use of lots

- (1) No lot comprising shop or commercial premises may be used without the prior written approval of the owners corporation for the following purposes (whether or not in conjunction with or as well as any other purpose):-

Adult bookshop or shop selling primarily or substantially adult books magazines or products of an adult or sex related nature;

Body piercing and or tattooing;

Food preparation and or cooking involving the use of deep frying equipment of any kind;

Amusements, recreational or gaming purposes including but not limited to pin ball machines and any similar equipment, computer and or animated games, pinball parlour, amusement hall or similar.

The owners corporation may in its absolute discretion withhold or arbitrarily refuse consent to any of the uses referred to herein or impose such terms and conditions as it deems fit

SPECIAL BYLAW 1

The owners - strata plan 73713 by special resolution pursuant to section 110 of the strata schemes management act 2015 agree to pass a special by-law that delegates its function to approve minor renovations to the strata committee.

SPECIAL BYLAW 2

The owners – strata plan 73713 Specially resolve to adopt the common property memorandum annexed and marked 'B'.

2. Ceiling/Roof	(a) false ceilings inside the lot installed by an owner after the registration of the strata plan
3. Electrical	(a) air conditioning systems, whether inside or outside of a lot, which serve only that lot (b) fuses and fuse boards within the lot and serving only that lot (c) in-sink food waste disposal systems and water filtration systems (d) electrical wiring in non-common property walls within a lot and serving only that lot (e) light fittings, light switches and power point sockets within the lot serving only that lot (f) telephone, television, internet and cable wiring within noncommon property walls and serving only that lot (g) telephone, television, internet and cable service and connection sockets (h) intercom handsets serving one lot and associated wiring located within non-common walls
4. Entrance door	(a) door locks additional to the original lock (or subsequent replacement of the original lock) (b) keys, security cards and access passes
5. Floor	(a) floor tiles and any associated waterproofing affixed by an owner after the registration of the strata plan (b) lacquer and staining on surface of floorboards or parquet flooring (c) internal carpeting and floor coverings, unfixed floating floors (d) mezzanines and stairs within lots that are not shown or referred to in the strata plan
6. General	(a) internal (non-common property) walls (b) paintwork inside the lot (including ceiling and entrance door) (c) built-in wardrobes, cupboards, shelving (d) dishwasher
