Arltunga Tourist Drive – Take a trip out into the East MacDonnell Ranges and find yourself on the Arltunga Tourist Drive. With a lavish start throughout the ranges and over 30kms of 4WD track to explore. You will discover many historical sites such as mines, old miner’s camps and various stone buildings.

Binns Track – Take an epic journey on the Northern Territory’s newest 4WD route, the Binns Track. Running from Mt Dare on the SA border to the township of Timber Creek, the track covers 2,191 kms and winds through many of the Northern Territory’s lesser-known nature reserves and national parks. You’ll pass through the outback towns of Alice Springs and Tennant Creek and traverse some of the Northern Territory’s most interesting landscapes in the western Simpson Desert, East MacDonnell Ranges, Davenport Ranges National Park and Gregory National Park.

Chambers Pillar – With over 100kms of 4WD track to experience, Chambers Pillar is a day trip or overnight camping adventure not to be missed! You can explore the reserve, home of the spectacular column towering 50 metres above the Simpson Desert plain, on foot and learn about the ancient Aboriginal legends within the area.

Mereenie Loop – The off the beaten track passage connecting the West MacDonnell Ranges and Kings Canyon. This scenic drive is a total 160km of 4WD track and requires a permit to cross.

Old Andado Track – Travel the scenic 4WD roads of the Simpson Desert from Alice Springs to Oodnadatta. Camp among the sand dunes and enjoy the red sand and deep blue skies.



Owen Springs – A popular 4WD experience for visitors seeking a quiet bush camp. The Hugh River runs the length of the reserve and offers many great places for camping, picnicking, birdwatching and swimming. The reserve is a 30-40-minute drive south-west of Alice Springs. Discover the rocky gorges and red sandy country surrounding the river with its stretches of broad sandy banks lined with shady River Red Gums and the large waterhole after which the reserve takes its name. Camping is allowed within Lawrence Gorge and near Redbank Waterhole. A high clearance 4WD is essential to negotiate the track into the reserve.

Palm Valley – Home of ancient landscapes and Aboriginal cultural sites. Palm Valley shelters groves of rare red cabbage palms – botanic remnants from millions of years ago, when Central Australia was lush with tropical forests. Here you will see a diverse range of plant species, including tall palms and cycads, many of which are unique to the area. The main gorge features high red cliffs, stately river red gums, cool waterholes and a number of walks. The drive in is a 4WD lovers paradise with 22km of high clearance terrain.

Plenty Hwy – 800km of 4WD track, with stunning scenery, wide open skies, solidarity and few towns in between. The Plenty Highway is the ultimate outback 4WD experience.

Rainbow Valley – Located 75kms south of Alice Springs this 4WD track leads you to sandstone bluffs and cliffs with bands of different coloured rock. An easy day trip from Alice Springs, it is at its most spectacular in the early morning light or late afternoon sun when it changes from ochre red to orange and purple.

Wallace Rockhole – 70kms west of Alice Springs, this Aranda community is home to the Wallace Rockhole Tourist Park which offers camping, tours and the opportunity to discover Aboriginal rock art and paintings.
