## CAMPING REGULATIONS NORTHERN TERRITORY

We pride ourselves on offering the best camping and adventure locations in the country. In order to protect our environment, maintain these spots and avoid damage to pastoral land, private property, sacred sites and other places of production, cultural or natural significance, we urge people to please camp ONLY in the dedicated tourist/camping parks and/or structured campsites.

A place of cultural or natural significance includes any site of significance according to Aboriginal tradition. It may include an area just off a track or over a sandhill. Please be aware that it is an offence to interfere with a sacred site in the Territory and tough penalties apply, even if the person interfering with the site is not aware of its significance.

The majority of the landscape you are travelling through is private property, such as cattle stations. There are penalties for trespassing on this land.

It is also an offence to camp on a road or a road related area in the Territory. A roadrelated area includes any of the following:

- (a) an area that divides a road:
- (b) a footpath or nature strip adjacent to a road;
- (c) an area that is not a road and that is open to the public and designated for use by cyclists or animals;
- (d) an area that is not a road and that is open to or used by the public for driving, riding or parking vehicles.

Please remember to take all your rubbish with you. This includes food scraps, bush bathroom waste, general litter and vehicle debris. Leave no trace.
