



SEVEN EPIC DRIVES

Binns Track

ALICE SPRINGS, TENNANT CREEK AND KATHERINE REGIONS

A quintessential off-the-beaten-track adventure, stretching 2,230km from the arid outback of the SA/NT border, to the tropical rivers of the Katherine region. Named after Bill Binns, a ranger with NT Parks and Wildlife, whose dream it was to create an epic journey showcasing the diversity of wildlife, plants and natural wonders of his beloved NT.

Explorers Way

ADELAIDE TO DARWIN

One of the great Australian road trips passing some of Australia's favourite natural icons, including Uluru and Kata Tjuta, Watarka/Kings Canyon, the Tjoritja/Macdonnell Ranges, Karlu Karlu/Devils Marbles, Nitmiluk National Park and the waterfalls of Litchfield National Park. Recommended to be done over a minimum 14 days on a sealed highway following the route of the 1862 explorer John McDouall Stuart.

Natures Way

DARWIN - KAKADU - KATHERINE (VIA LITCHFIELD)

The best of the Top End. In five to ten days you can have an amazing adventure that links Darwin, Australia's vibrant tropical capital city, with the ancient cultural and natural wonders of Kakadu, Nitmiluk and Litchfield National Parks. This easy drive is completely on sealed roads. There are also some great four-wheel drive side-trips that take you to special spots in the lush northern tropics.

Outback Way

LAVERTON - ALICE SPRINGS - WINTON

Dubbed "Australia's Longest Shortcut," the Outback Way from Laverton Western Australia, through the Northern Territory's Red Centre to Winton in Queensland, is a 2800km odyssey across the heart of the continent. Almost half of the track is dirt roads, so you will need a four-wheel-drive, but if you want to take the road less travelled, that's all part of the adventure.

Overlanders Way

TOWNSVILLE - TENNANT CREEK

The Overlander's Way is an experience you'll never forget. This self-drive track served as an important line during World War II and stretches across 1,550 kilometres taking you from the ocean to the Outback. You can travel from the Great Barrier Reef to Australia's Outback in a matter of days, so make sure you pack your flippers and hiking boots.

Red Centre Way

ALICE SPRINGS TO ULURU RETURN

One of Australia's great drive journeys, it features some of the country's most famous landmarks, beautiful hidden gems, sweeping desert landscapes and the oldest living culture in the world. Highlights include Tjoritja / West Macdonnell National Park, Kings Canyon Rim Walk in Watarka National Park; and of course the iconic Uluru-Kata Tjuta National Park.

Tanami Track

HALLS CREEK TO ALICE SPRINGS

Crossing the expanse of the Tanami Desert, the Tanami Track is actually a fairly well-formed earth/gravel road and the shortest route from Halls Creek WA to Alice Springs. It takes two days to cross the vast expanse of the Tanami Desert, allowing time for you to take in a few awe-inspiring surprises along the way, including the second largest meteorite crater in the world.

1. Alice Springs Reptile Centre

2. Alice Springs School of the Air Visitor Centre

3. Royal Flying Doctor Service Alice Springs Tourist Facility

Visit the Museum home of the RFDS. See, experience and learn through the wonder of technology the heroic tales of the birth and growth of the Royal Flying Doctor Service.

4. Women's Museum of Australia and Old Goole

Be inspired by the incredible achievements of women at the first museum dedicated to women in Australia. Explore what life was like for those who lived and worked at the former H.M. Prison and Labour Camp, opened in 1938. Experience both attractions for one entry fee.

5. National Road Transport Hall of Fame

This unique museum showcases the rich and important history of the road and transport industry and the essential role it's played in servicing remote areas of Australia and the Outback. It covers all forms of road transport from the camel trains of old to today's modern road trains and stretchliner coaches.

HERMANNSBURG HISTORIC PRECINCT

This nationally listed heritage site includes the physical remains of the Hermannsburg Mission, the longest running mission in Australia. The Kata Lango Tea Rooms is a place where you can enjoy morning tea, lunch, or afternoon tea, and soak up the atmosphere. View beautiful examples of Hermannsburg Art at the birth place of Albert Namatjira.
