NARROGIN ARBORETUM IN FOXES LAIR

The Narrogin arboretum was one of 53 arboreta established by the then Forests Department during the period 1955 - 1965. Agriculture was rapidly expanding and it was widely recognised that over clearing of the land was common and that replanting would be necessary. The purpose of the arboreta was to evaluate a range of local, regional, Australian and overseas species that were thought to have promise for planting in the wheatbelt and goldfields. Some thrived and others failed.

Since the mid 1980's the arboretum became neglected and overgrown until the Friends of Foxes Lair cleared regrowth and rubbish and pruned the surviving trees, and planted new ones.
