Entally House was the family home of Thomas Reibey, Premier of Tasmania from 1876–1877. The estate was established in 1819 by Thomas Haydock Reibey II, son of Thomas and **Mary Reibey**, one of the richest and most successful businesswomen in Australia. Entally historic site consists of Entally House and various outbuildings, including Australia's oldest conservatory, grand, parklike surroundings with magnificent gardens, a vineyard, Regency furnishings, fine silverware, horse-drawn coaches and agricultural implements.

Take a leisurely stroll along **Main Street** to the **Hadspen South Esk Lions Park**, enjoy the picturesque scenery, the wildlife – cockatoos, kookaburras and platypus. The old bridge site was always a meeting point for swimmers and picnickers alike and remains the same today. Stroll along the **Hadspen River Walk** from the **Recreation Ground** or **Skate Park**. In 1987 the Lions Club of Hadspen South Esk inc was chartered and the Club's first project was to clear the area to form the **Lions Park of Hadspen**. BBQs, seating and a playground area were installed by the Hadspen Lions Club and are now maintained by the Meander Valley Council.
