During your trip, accommodation is available in a range of styles and prices. Some camps, cabins, caravans, and motels, cabins and caravans are available to ensure you get the accommodation you need.

Rail Access

Great Southern Railway's Indian Pacific rail services this region of Australia. It offers travel between Sydney, Adelaide and Perth. Travellers crossing the Nullarbor have the option of taking their car with them on the train, allowing for a return journey by road, or vice versa. For timetables and further information visit www.gsr.com.au.

Accommodation

During your journey your accommodation options range from hotels, motels, cabin parks, caravan parks, homestays and roadhouses. It is recommended where possible to pre-plan your holiday and book in advance to ensure you get the accommodation suited to your needs.

OUTBACK TRAVEL

Outback Travel

Off the main roads

- Inform family or friends of your travel plans and intended route.
- Check road conditions through road reports, road transport, police stations and locals.
- Carry comprehensive maps.
- Drive at a reduced speed on unsealed roads.
- Carry extra spare tyres and tools.
- Obey road closure signs.
- Hire emergency communication equipment e.g. satellite phones.
- Note that mobile phones have limited coverage across the Nullarbor.
- Report road conditions to locals if you have arrived from a location that is "off the beaten track".

Mechanical Tips

- Service your vehicle before the journey. Tell the mechanic you are leaving on a long road trip. Carry spare spark plugs and fuses.
- Check radiator and hoses. Flush radiator and carry spare hoses.
- Check fuel and temperature gauges are working.
- Check fan belt for tension and cracking. Carry a spare.
- Check tyres, including spare(s), for wear, tread and inflation.
- Tools: include wheel brace, jack, torch, jumper leads, tow rope.







EUCLA TELEGRAPH STATION RUINS

Opened in 1877, the Eucla Telegraph Station helped link WA with the rest of Australia and the world, sending 11,000 messages annually (just 33 years after Samuel Morse invented the telegraph). The first message, sent to Perth, 8 December 1877 stated "Eucla line opened. Hurrah."

MADURA PASS

From the top of the Madura Pass lookout, visitors will obtain spectacular views of the Roe Plains. Settled in 1876, Madura Station was used to breed horses for the British Army (India).

EYRE BIRD OBSERVATORY

The Eyre Bird Observatory is housed in the historic Eyre Telegraph Station that was built in 1897. Day visitors are welcome (entry fee applies) or stay overnight. Accommodation and meals are available. Advanced bookings are preferred. Turn off

17km east of Cocklebiddy, 4WD access only for final 12km. Free pickups for 2WD overnight guests by prior arrangement. Phone 08 9039 3450.

CAIGUNA BLOWHOLE

This unique blowhole makes for an interesting diversion, 5km west of Caiguna. Follow the signs.

AUSTRALIA'S LONGEST STRAIGHT ROAD

Stop for a photo opportunity at the road sign that promotes Australia's longest straight stretch of roadway at 145kms.

BALLADONIA CULTURAL HERITAGE MUSEUM

The Cultural Heritage Museum uses the latest in computer-controlled interactive technology to recreate the area's history. Aboriginal Dreaming, pioneers, Afghan cameleers and the crash landing of NASA's Skylab in 1979 are all included.

FRASER RANGE STATION

On the edge of the Nullarbor you are confronted by a range of scenic granite hills—the Fraser Range—surrounded by the world's largest eucalyptus hardwood forest. As the first station settled on the Nullarbor, Fraser Range Station is steeped in a history that is still evident today with its stone buildings, gully dams and tanks originally constructed utilising convict and Aboriginal labour. Camping and accommodation available.

NORSEMAN

In Norseman, a spectacular panoramic view awaits those visitors who take the short 2km drive up to Beacon Hill. Be regaled with history from the display boards on the quaint information hut that perches at the top. You can also enjoy a short walking trail through the beautiful bushland that leads off the top of the hill.

WAVE ROCK (HYDEN)



Located just 4km east of Hyden, Wave Rock rises 15m above the ground like a giant wave about to break. It is streaked with vertical bands of red, ochre and sand grey, simulating the rolling movement of the sea.

ESPERANCE



The Esperance region contains six national parks including Cape Le Grand and the Fitzgerald River. A climb to the top of Frenchman's Peak at Cape Le Grand National Park will provide a panoramic view of the surrounding area. There are thrilling four-wheel-drive tours of coastal areas and sand dunes available, as well as some excellent self drive routes, including the Great Ocean Drive.

KALGOORLIE-BOULDER



Visit the WA Museum and Hannans North Tourist Mine to gain an insight into the rich history of the Eastern Goldfields and the city's mining heritage. Kalgoorlie offers a range of day and half day tours that give you a glimpse of life in a major Goldfields town, covering everything from history through to the awesome Super Pit mine at the edge of Boulder. Just out of Kalgoorlie a visit to Coolgardie and the famous Gormley Sculptures "Inside Australia" exhibit at Lake Ballard is a must.

Moseley Nobs Walking Trail is 2.8 km long, passing up the valley between two of the nobs to the "Botenella Native Well"

THE AUSTRALIAN FARMER SCULPTURE - WUDINNA



Located on the Eyre Highway at Wudinna is the wonderful granite sculpture known as the "Australian Farmer". Sculpted by reknowned artist Marijan Bekic, the work depicts the settlement of the upper Eyre Peninsula and is symbolic of the highs and lows of agricultural life in the region. The sculpture was funded entirely by the community and its pioneering families, utilizing locally sourced materials, resources and volunteers.

GAWLER RANGES NATIONAL PARK



Gawler Ranges National Park is a 120,000ha reserve and is situated 40km north of the Eyre Highway. It boasts volcanic rock hills, dramatic scenic beauty, abundant wildlife and seasonal wildflowers. Camping, bushwalking and passive nature study are popular activities undertaken in the park.

CEDUNA ABORIGINAL ARTS & CULTURE CENTRE



HEAD OF BIGHT



Just 12km off the Eyre Highway is Head of Bight—a premier whale watching area of Australia—where the white sand dunes and beaches meet the Bunda Cliffs of the Nullarbor. Up to 170 Southern Right Whales may gather at any one time. The boardwalks at the Head of Bight ensure fantastic vistas of these beautiful creatures and the sheer drop of the towering cliffs into the pounding Southern Ocean. Whale watching season starts 1st May through to 31st October. Fees apply.

Please Note: Head of Bight carpark (depending on where you park) can be up to 300 metres from the boardwalk. All areas are wheelchair accessible right from the carpark to the viewing platform. Wheelchairs are available from the Interpretive Centre free of charge for those who cannot do the walk.

NULLARBOR BUNDA CLIFFS



Three coastal lookouts, the first located 50km West of Nullarbor. The Plain drops 90 metres into the pounding Southern Ocean. The Bunda Cliffs stretch in an unbroken natural rampart for over 200km from Twin Rocks, Head of Bight to the Merdayerrah Sandpatch.

WA/SA BORDER VILLAGE



Border Village International Signpost and "Rooney II" statue - photo opportunity.



Norseman is an historical gold mining town and Western Australia's gateway to the Nullarbor. Legend has it that a prospector named Laurie Sinclair tethered his horse "Hardy Norseman" to a tree overnight in the 1890s. By morning the horse had unearthed a piece of gold-bearing quartz by pawing the ground. Over 5 million ounces of gold have been taken out of Norseman, making it the second richest goldfield in WA. Norseman is also one end of the Granite and Woodlands Discovery Trail, a 300km unsealed road from Norseman to Hyden with excellent interpretive signage and some of Australia's most pristine woodlands. Norseman offers a range of services and facilities for travellers. Don't miss:

- Beacon Hill Lookout and Walk Trail. A 360° panorama of town and surrounding bushlands.
- Tin Camels and the statue of Norseman.
- Dundas Coach Road Heritage Trail.

Balladonia



Loosely translated, “Balladonia” comes from the Aboriginal word meaning “big red rock”. Balladonia made world headlines in 1979 when space debris from Skylab landed 40km east on Woolba Sheep Station.

- Cultural Heritage Museum, computer-controlled interactive technology to recreate the area’s history (Balladonia Hotel complex).
- Arid Desert Woodland (counted among the world’s oldest and most dense landscapes).
- Newman Rocks is a popular spot for a break from the long black strip (1km off road).
- Cape Arid National Park and Israelite Bay access points (via 4WD track - check conditions).

Caiguna



The stunning Baxter cliffs are named after Edward John Eyre’s overseer, John Baxter, who tragically lost his life on 29th April 1841. The “90 Mile Straight” from Caiguna to Balladonia is the longest straight stretch of highway in Australia (146.6km).

- Caiguna Blowhole. 5km west of Caiguna (follow the signs).
- “Australia’s longest straight road” sign (photo opportunity).

Cocklebiddy



Originally established as an Aboriginal mission in early pioneer times, it is a nature lover’s paradise.

- Chapel Rock formation and picnic area, located 4km east of Cocklebiddy. Look for a track on the side of the road.
- Twilight Cove is a popular fishing and whale watching spot, 32km south of Cocklebiddy (4WD track).
- Eyre Bird Observatory housed in the Historic Eyre Telegraph Station. Phone 08 9039 3450.
- Spectacular Baxter Cliffs and Nuytsland Nature Reserve are located southwest of Cocklebiddy by way of a rough 4WD track. Check road conditions locally.





GOLDEN QUEST DISCOVERY TRAIL



The Golden Quest Discovery Trail is a self-drive adventure in one of the world's most famous gold-producing regions. The circuit trail—from Coolgardie in the southern Goldfields to Laverton in the north—passes many interesting sites of historical and cultural significance.

The 965km Golden Quest Discovery Trail can be enjoyed in parts or as a whole. Whether you use Kalgoorlie-Boulder as a base for day visits or you plan to set out on a three or four day journey, the experiences found along the trail are sure to be memorable. A 4WD will be required to complete

the entire trail, however much of it can be experienced using a conventional vehicle.

Along the Trail you will trace the steps of some of Australia's greatest explorers and pioneers. See the once famous Poseidon Nickel Mine at Mt Windarra and the new nickel mine at Murrin Murrin.

Spend some time discovering the inspirational Lake Ballard where renowned international sculptor Antony Gormley has created 51 sculptures on a remote salt lake.

Visit the historic precinct at Gwalia, near Leonora. Once a bustling gold mining town with a population of some 3000, today Gwalia is a ghost town where visitors can explore a shanty town and visit the museum or, stay in Hoover House,

which was commissioned by Herbert Hoover the 31st President of the United States.

Kalgoorlie-Boulder, is the home to the Golden Mile Super Pit - 3.7km long, 1.5km wide and 480m deep open cut gold mine, the largest in the southern hemisphere. Take time to also travel to Coolgardie, dubbed "Mother of the Goldfields" and site of the original gold discoveries. See the historic streetscape, call into the Goldfields' Exhibition Museum, pay a visit to Warden Finnerty's House and locate famous explorer Ernest Giles headstone in the cemetery.

Your coastal adventure begins as you head west to the Yorke Peninsula, where the coast includes rugged shores, sheltered coves and hidden bays.

Seafood-lovers will be in heaven on Eyre Peninsula, aptly named Australia's Seafood Frontier. As you journey south you will discover some of the nation's best seafood including, King George whiting, oysters, tuna, prawns, calamari, kingfish, snapper, lobster, abalone, mussels—to name just a few.

The journey around the south of the Eyre Peninsula will also provide the opportunity for personal wildlife interactions and swimming with a wide range of marine wildlife including tuna, dolphins, sea lions, and the Great White shark.

The voyage across the north of the Eyre Peninsula will provide you access to some of

the most beautiful Australian outback scenery and wildlife.

Be sure to spend time exploring the Gawler Ranges and Lake Gairdner.

Then, follow the black ribbon of highway across the "treeless landscape" the quiet and endless horizon known as the Nullarbor Plain. Between May and October stop along the way to see the magnificent Southern Right Whales frolicking just off the coast as you observe from top of 60 metre high sheer limestone cliffs.

Head Of Bight



The most spectacular land-based whale watching site in South Australia—or indeed, the world—is the Head of the Bight near Nullarbor with the largest congregation of Southern Right Whales in Australia. Visitors can follow a cliff-top boardwalk to viewing platforms from where the whales and their calves can be seen from June to October. The Head of the Bight Interpretive Centre tells of the whales’ journey from the Antarctic each year. The harsh Nullarbor landscape belies the deeply woven story of its creation and thousands of years of occupation by indigenous Australians. Open year round.

Nullarbor



The Nullarbor oasis is located 94km to the west of Yalata. You have now reached the treeless plain or “nullus arbor”. Once part of the ocean floor, the Nullarbor is the world’s biggest, flattest piece of limestone, covering an area of approximately 200,000 square kilometres and up to 300 metres thick.

- Scenic flights July - October (Nullarbor Roadhouse).
- Murrawijinie Caves, 15km north of Nullarbor Roadhouse.
