

Pioneer Valley Driving Itinerary Mackay - Finch Hatton - Eungella National Park

Time to complete itinerary: I day

Distance travelled: Approximately 195km round trip

Total walking time: Approximately 2-4 hours

Start in Mackay

- Drive toward the southern entrance of Mackay, where the Bruce Highway meets the Peak Downs Highway.
- Follow the Peak Downs Highway 6km west toward Walkerston.
- Turn right on to the Mackay-Eungella Road towards Eungella National Park.

A Roadtrip Through the Valley

- Travelling along the Mackay-Eungella Road, you will pass through the townships of Marian, Mirani, Garget, Pinnacle and Finch Hatton before the drive up the range to Eungella.
- The Melba House Visitor Information Centre just before the Marian township (20km west from Mackay). Stop in and explore the former house of opera singer Dame Nellie Melba. Open 7 days, 9am to 3pm.
- Country Charm Garden & Gifts approximately 2km past Pleystowe. Turn left (heading west) onto Rocky Waterholes-Wollingford Road and follow it 2km south). This unique homeware store serves food and coffee as well as high teas (bookings essential).
- The Pinnacle Hotel is world famous for its huge, tasty pies. The hotel is located just
 past the sign for Pinnacle (50km west from Mackay), around the bend and on the
 left. Open 7 days for lunch.
- The **Church Café Pinnacle** is a taste of Italy in the Valley. Open 9am to 4pm daily (except Wednesday).

Finch Hatton Gorge

From the Pinnacle Pub, there's only 5km until the turn off to Finch Hatton Gorge*.
 Watch for the signs to turn right on to Owens Creek Loop Road. There's the option to swim just under the bridge or continue on.





















Finch Hatton Gorge (cont'd)

- If continuing, you'll need to follow Owens Creek Loop Road and then turn left after 500m and then right after 700m. Follow Gorge Road for another 1.3km before taking another left and then right after 500m. Gorge Road will continue on for 5.7km until you reach parking spots for Finch Hatton Gorge.
- Take a refreshing swim at one of the many clear rock pools found in the rainforest, and watch the water cascade over the large boulders upstream.
- There are two bushwalks at Finch Hatton Gorge. Take the well-formed track to the Araluen Cascades (allow 45 minutes each way) or continue between great granite boulders to the lookout above Wheel of Fire Waterfall (a further 1.4 kilometres). This walk includes a number of stairs but the views are well worth the effort.
- Forest Flying* is a unique ecotourism experience where you can go zip-lining 25 metres above ground through the rainforest canopy. You'll need to detour off Gorge Road before you reach Finch Hatton Gorge. Follow the signs. Open daily for tours 10.30am and 1pm. Bookings essential 4958 3359.
- The **Ulysses Garden Café*** located at 723 Gorge Road, across from Finch Hatton Gorge Cabins. It's a great spot for organic options for lunch, icecream or coffee. Phone 4958 3572.
- After the swim at the Gorge, return back to the main road (Mackay-Eungella Road) and pass through the quaint town of Finch Hatton.
- The Gift Shed is located across the road from the Finch Hatton Pub on the left-hand side along an adjacent side street.

Eungella National Park

- Continue along the Mackay-Eungella Road and travel up the range to the Eungella township (approximately 16km). At the top of the range, take the first turn right for the great view own the Pioneer Valley.
- **Great place to stop: Eungella Chalet** is at the top of the range on the left. It has great views right across the Valley and is open 7 days for lunch and dinner.
- Follow the main road around the bend left and continue to Broken River via Eungella Dam Road.
- **Great place to stop:** The **Sky Window Walk** is a short 250m walk from the road to spectacular views across the Pioneer Valley and signs along the way will give insight into Indigenous culture.
- Venture onto Broken River where you will find the Visitor Information Centre and the viewing platform. This is your chance to see platypus, eels, fish and turtles in the wild
- Most of the **short walks** leave from Broken River, which are signposted.
