

WHAT'S BITING NOV REPORT

It has been a rather cool Spring so far, which has kept some desirable fish on the menu for longer than normal, while the typical Summer bunch are steadily making their presence felt. If you want to sample the best of the south and plan a fishing getaway, then the McLaren Vale and Fleurieu Coast is the spot to be as we approach the 'fishy' end of the year.

Mixed weather conditions have featured throughout Spring and this has kept species like mullet, salmon and others around in good numbers. The arrival of ever-increasing numbers of mulloway, sharks, yellowfin whiting and others also reminds us that Christmas is close as well!

Below is a species snapshot for the area, which hopefully helps you get hooked up this November!

FISH SPECIES	WHERE TO FISH?	HOT TIPS
Mulloway	Onkaparinga River, Moana, Christies Beach	Good fish in the river, which will also be cruising the nearby beaches as the weather warms
Mullet	Moana, Onkaparinga River, Port Noarlunga, O'Sullivan Beach	Fish light line, with the chance of a salmon or flathead also
Squid	Aldinga, Seaford, Port Noarlunga, Christies Beach, O'Sullivan Beach	Squid have been firing, and are perfect targets for beginners
Bream	Onkaparinga River, Port Noarlunga Jetty, O'Sullivan Beach	The river is fishing well, however, the jetty shallows or O'Sullivan Beach can be great options. Try around the structure or creek entrance at O'Sullivan Beach
KG Whiting	Aldinga, Moana, O'Sullivan Beach	Try in a little closer, but vary your depth and give it time when berlying
Yellowfin Whiting	Onkaparinga River	Yellowfin confirmed at the mouth, meaning any beach close by is worth a go
Garfish	Seaford, Port Noarlunga, Christies Beach, Port Stanvac	Be patient and spend time setting a berley trail. A great feed awaits
Tommies	Aldinga, Maslin Beach, O'Sullivan Beach.	Throw a 3-10g metal lure or small plastic, it can work way better than bait when the fish are schooled up
Flathead	Aldinga, Onkaparinga River, Christies Beach, O'Sullivan Beach	Try a salted pilchard tail and running sinker along the beaches mentioned, or work soft plastics
Salmon	Onkaparinga River, Southport, Port Noarlunga, O'Sullivan Beach	Port Noarlunga and Southport have been consistent mostly in the morning
