General Information

Tourism Whitsundays

Tourism Whitsundays is the organisation responsible for destination marketing and visitor attraction for the Whitsunday region. It is the official agency recognised by Tourism and Events Queensland and the Whitsunday Regional Council to lead the promotion of the region as a tourism destination. Tourism Whitsundays markets all aspects of the region including the Great Barrier Reef, Whitsunday Islands and Coast, accommodation, boating and sailing, fishing, touring, recreational activities, adventure, dining, shopping, weddings and honeymoons, groups, conferencing and business events.

The Whitsundays

The Whitsundays is located in the Heart of the Great Barrier Reef. The region consists of 74 island wonders (including resorts on Hamilton Island, Daydream Island, Long Island, Camp Island and Hayman Island), the casual beach towns of Airlie Beach with its vast range of dining and shopping and Bowen home to some of the most beautiful beaches in the Whitsunday region, famed for its large granite boulder outcrops and snorkelling straight off the beach. Travel inland and experience the quaint hinterland villages of Proserpine, Australia's largest Barramundi impound at Lake Proserpine – where you just have to throw in a line and experience the thrill of catching a barra and the charming outback town of Collinsville.

Banks

Banks and ATMs are available in Airlie Beach Town Centre.

Access

The Whitsundays is located along Queensland's central coast in north-eastern Australia, approximately 1120km north of Brisbane and 630km south of Cairns.

Getting to the Whitsundays is simple, whether driving from nearby towns or travelling from the other side of Australia or the world.

Whitsunday Coast Airport, Proserpine (PPP)

Whitsunday Coast Airport is located near Proserpine, approximately 30 minutes to Airlie Beach. Buses and taxis meet every flight to transfer guests to Airlie Beach, or ferries to the island resorts. Car hire is also available at the airport.

Great Barrier Reef Airport, Hamilton Island (HTI)

Hamilton Island Airport is the central air hub for the Whitsunday Islands. The airport is the launchpad for scenic flights to both the reef and Whitehaven Beach. It is a convenient five minute trip to Hamilton Island Airport from the islands resort accommodation, shops and restaurants. All flights are met by ferry transfers between other island resorts and the mainland.

BY ROAD

The Bruce Highway is the major road linking Queensland's coastal cities and towns. The Bruce Highway runs through Proserpine and Bowen, with Airlie Beach located approximately 20 minutes' drive off the Bruce Highway at Proserpine. Just follow the signs to Airlie Beach and the Whitsunday Islands along Shute Harbour Road.

Major national coach operators such as Greyhound Australia, Premier and Oz Experience, include The Whitsundays in their regular scheduled services into the coastal community of Airlie Beach or Bowen from all major centres along the east coast of Australia.

BY RAIL

Queensland Rail can transport guests around Queensland via long-distance trains. Spirit of Queensland travels between Brisbane and Cairns, stopping in Proserpine with bus transfers to and from Airlie Beach.

Climate

Tropical. You're just north of the Tropic of Capricorn and, in summer particularly, it can be quite hot and humid. Refreshing rain showers and the lovely sea breeze can cool things down a little. Make sure you stay hydrated and sheltered from the sun.

Dining

Whether you just want a hot drink, a tasty light snack or a gourmet meal, Airlie Beach has some excellent cafes and restaurants, most of them located around the waterfront on Shute Harbour Road or at Port of Airlie.

Environment & Stinger Season

The season for jellyfish generally starts with the onset of the wet across the top of Northern Australia, usually around October and lasts until April. It is recommended to wear a stinger suit when snorkelling, diving or swimming. These will be provided by tour operators while out on tour.

Free Activities

Airlie Beach Lagoon

The Airlie Beach Lagoon is situated right in the centre of Airlie Beach and has become the focal point of the area. When you want to meet someone, you meet 'at the Lagoon'. If you want a great day of relaxation with no admission fee, 'spend a day at the Lagoon'.



Local Whitsundays residents fall in love with the lagoon each visit as much as the visitors do. The lagoon is surrounded by grassy knolls, perfect for a spot of sunbathing or finding a quiet spot in the shade to read a book. The sandy beach area at one end provides a safe stinger free environment for the children to play in the shallows and the lagoon is surrounded by landscaped gardens for added aesthetic appeal. A children's pool is situated at one end.

Airlie Beach Markets

The Airlie Beach Markets are situated on the Airlie Beach foreshore. Stalls include fresh fruit and veg, food, sweets and coffee, clothing, souvenirs, art, fishing supplies, books, plants, massage, and much, much more. The biggest markets in the Whitsunday area, you can't miss a visit to the Airlie Beach markets on a Saturday morning.

Boathaven Beach

Boathaven Beach is situated on the new peninsula known as The Beacons, and boasts 60,000 cubic metres of soft, white sand, a northerly aspect and is the area's first all-tide beach. Enjoy a day of swimming, sunbathing and lap up the views out the Coral Sea and islands beyond, before popping over to the adjacent marina and shops for a bite to eat or an ice cream along the main street.

The Airlie Creek Track

The 850 metre Airlie Creek Track slowly winds up the hill behind Airlie Beach along a gravel path, featuring rare flora and fauna such as the Whitsunday Bottle Tree and the endangered Proserpine Rock Wallaby which are only found in this region. The track winds you through a tranquil forest, which is home to magnificent fig trees, sub-tropical plants, beautiful native birds and ends up at scenic natural rock pools. The walk back offers views of the beautiful blue Coral Sea and Whitsunday Islands.

Walking time: allow one hour. Access: from Waterson Way, Airlie Beach.

Whitsunday Great Walk

On the rugged Conway Range behind Airlie Beach lies Conway State Forest, home to the Whitsunday Great Walk. This beautiful forest contains lowland tropical rainforest remnants and picturesque rocky creeks. Volcanic activity millions of years ago created this rugged landscape and the offshore islands.

Walking through this wildlife haven is a unique experience as the seasons come and go with different sights, smells and sounds. You may see the blue flash of a

Ulysses butterfly after rain, smell lemon myrtle flowers in summer or hear the distinctive call of the Wompoo Fruit-Dove when the trees around you are fruiting.

You will pass majestic tulip oaks on the first day, walk through lush palm valleys and moss gardens on the second, and finish on the third with views of the Whitsunday Islands through open woodland.

The Whitsunday Great Walk is open to mountain bikes with sections of the 36km dual-use trail graded 2, 3 and 4 for mountain bikes.

Accommodation Options

Backpackers By the Bay

A small, clean and friendly backpacker hostel, situated on a small hill, overlooking the Port of Airlie. The hostel is a short walk from the main street with all its shops and cafes, but far enough away to ensure a quiet night's sleep. Backpackers By The Bay is the only purpose-built backpacker hostel in the Whitsundays. It was built with a focus on communal areas, which maximises guest interaction. Australian family-owned and operated.

The Whitsundays is the heart of the Great Barrier Reef and the tropical paradise of Discovery Parks – Airlie Beach is the heart of camping in the region. Nestled alongside the rainforest of Conway National Park and in a protected amphitheatre the park has a resort feel with a sensational swimming pool and outdoor spas where you can laze under the umbrellas all day. You won't be able to drag the kids out of the splashtacular water park, a haven for youngsters and a few adults too.

Continuing the resort vibe you'll find thatched roof villas and cabins set amongst the tall native trees. The cabins are fully equipped to provide you with everything you need for your stay. With many variations of walks available and trails ranging in difficulty and length, they create bespoke tours to suit the needs, abilities and timings of your group. Absolute Airlie also have a range of local, experienced and knowledgeable guides who can deliver compelling, relevant and engaging content. Catering for school groups looking for a nature-based educational experience that also offers opportunities for team building, adventure-seeking and discovery.

Whitsunday Island Camping Connections can offer your students an experience that they will remember for a lifetime while giving them an educational experience. The Whitsundays are made up of 74 Continental Islands. They are a great landscape of the Australian Geological history, from the Volcanic ages making the harsh landscape to the ice ages covering the land. The Whitsundays also contains the history of Traditional Owners of the land, dating back to some of the Earliest settlements found on the Australian coast.

The Islands have a range of bushwalks from intermediate to the more extreme; some to breathtaking lookouts, others visiting historical sites.

Sitting in the heart of the Great Barrier Reef, these Continental Islands have fringing reefs which expand towards the depths, comprising of a range of Hard and Soft Corals and home to an array of reef fish and marine species.

There is much to explore and endless activities to be had, from Geological to Marine. There is something to suit everyone.

The friendly crew prepare all meals freshly onboard and tour guide with all snorkel and beach activities. Photos are also taken throughout the trip which is shown on the vessels' sizeable flat-screen TV's for kids to see the day's activities with an Eco marine educational slide show. The minimum required number is ten guests on a single vessel, and both vessels combined can carry a maximum of 56 guests.

Wings offer 2-day 1-night, and 2-day 2-night educational tours with a set itinerary and marine educational activities onboard and in the water. Options for longer charters are also available. Each student will receive a discover snorkel skills certificate of completion (DSS), a hat and a copy of their trip photos.

The crew are trained at the highest safety standard, and each has a blue card. Extra flotation and safety lifejacket provided for less confident kids. Prerequisite for children is minimum aged ten years old, and they must be comfortable in the water to do any in-water activities. Basic level of swimming is a must.

The Whitsunday Islands offer the most fantastic weather throughout the year with whale season between June to September. Each year the Whales migrate north to our tropical waters to mate, which can be an amazing experience marine wildlife experience to see!
