

Surfing in the islands


anuatu offers some of the best and unfrequented surf spots in the world scattered all around the 83 islands. Pele Island well deserves to be pinpointed on every surfer's map! Only one hour away from Port Vila its long beautiful beaches and swells are waiting for you.

The place owe its reputation to the easy access to the waves even during low tides. When you're out on the water, expect to

be joined by the local villagers. Since 2006, the Pele Surf Association has initiated several programs to promote surfing on the island. The association is affiliated to the Vanuatu Surfing association which is very active in the archipelago. Kendrick, originally from Pele was among the first ones to join the program. He keeps great memories of these times. "I remember that we didn't have enough boards so we used our moms' washboards to practice bodyboarding. We then shared a unique surf brought to us by a priest. We enjoyed it so much that after only a few months, we were ready to participate in our first competition in Pango." Many tourists have come to Pele since and a group of generous Australian female surfers offered a few boards as a souvenir. Since then, the passion and the practice continued to grow. Kendrick hopes to be able to import more boards in the future now that the borders reopen. "Pele is a great spot, and the island is scaling up its accommodation for those who would like to stay overnight and experience those morning swells"

imon Charley and Patis Nikiau are the runners from Tanna who won VTO's Vanuatu Volcano Run. The Run was no easy feat, as the course circled Mt Yasur from sea to summit, in the middle of a storm — and yet the pair managed to complete the 25km course in just 1 hour 51 minutes and 35 seconds.

Simon and Patis come from Lamakara, a village on the northern slopes of the volcano, and they were proud to represent their village against other clubs and provincial runners on their home territory.

As part of their prize as overall and men's category winners of the Vanuatu Volcano Run, Patis and Simon have travelled to attend the Le Trail Pacific which is taking place this Saturday 6 November on Efate,

Sports and tourism go hand in hand. Every year, thousands of people in Vanuatu each year travel to different parts of the country to participate, to watch or to help organise provincial and national sporting events. This called this 'sports tourism'.

Internationally, sports tourism is regarded as "one of the fastest growing sectors in the travel industry", according to UN's World Tourism Organization.

VTO's Vanuatu Volcano Run is an example of a sports tourism event, created to boost tourism visitation to south east Tanna. Over 200 runners, spectators, and officials from other islands attended the event, earning the area's small tourism businesses a combined total of Vt4 million in sales of accommodation, transport and food.

As domestic sports tourists, Simon and Patis are looking forward to running in Le Trail Pacific, another unique Vanuatu sports tourism event, organised by TitanFX.

But this time, they'll be away from their home island and will have the chance to sightsee around Efate and Port Vila as domestic tourists.

I like travelling as well, because every time I wake up somewhere new, I feel excited", says Patis Nikiau.

"I'm glad I get to combine both these interests when I travel to Port Vila to compete in the Le Trail Pacific event this Saturday", he says.

anuatu's tourism sector policy is focused on a sustainable type of development that promotes and harness community and responsible tourism. It also attempts to give recognition to cultural, environmental and people values. The Grand Manaro Trek is a good example of this policy. This new event, taking place in October, is a great opportunity to visit Ambae and the volcanic lake located at the heart of the island and to experience all that is traditional of the Ambaen culture. Before you pack, you need to know it will be a full day of hiking to Manaro but the effort is totally worth it. The place is unique.

The island has slowly moved back to normal with many inhabitants returning back to their homes after the 2005 eruption. On returning, new activities and opportunities were created for visitors to experience, both natural and cultural attractions and immersion to their traditions.

Ambae is also know for the Charles Godden Slow food and island basket festival programed later in the year.

Fun fact: Ambae's pyramid shape is due to its volcanic origins. It is by far the largest of the Vanuatu volcanoes, its base being 3000 metres below the sea. It is famous for its legendary disappearing. When seen from the East Coast of Santo, the island is a clear blue mountain rising from the ocean, especially under the early morning light. As the sun climbs, except for rare clear days the island quickly disappears behind a glare of sea haze.

If you go to Ambae don't be surprised if you see villagers play petanque. Petanque is a fun game and a sport that is very serious, mostly played in Provence region, in the South of France... and in Ambae. The goal is to score points by having balls (boules in French) closer to the target than the opponent after all boules have been thrown. This is achieved by throwing or rolling boules closer to the small target ball, officially called a jack (named a cochonnet in French) or by hitting the opponents' boules away from the target, while standing inside a circle with both feet on the ground. It is amazing to see the popularity of Petanque especially in West of the island.



In Maewo last year, the community built from scratch a beautiful beach volleyball court. The entire community organised a fundraising and actively participated to its installation. A ceremony took place to celebrate this joyful moment. The Vanuatu Volleyball Federation was invited and gifted a new volleyball net to this community project. Debbie Masauvakalo, president of the Vanuatu Beach Volleyball Federation attended the event with great pride and admiration for the good work.

As school teacher Morris Mera is encouraging young ones to practice actively. Great athletes are expected to come from the Taruskarua Beach Volleyball Club in the future.






Maskelyne Canoe Festival

he communities of the Maskelynes Islands, every year, host a canoe race and cultural festival. A typical program includes a feast of kastom dance, canoe-making, kava tasting, shared local meals, and of course the famous outrigger canoe race, finishing with an 'Island Night' celebration. There is usually plenty of time for pristine snorkelling and relaxation as well.

It is usually hosted around the 24th July, on the Children's Day, which is just a week before the Independence Day Celebrations.







Rom Dance

From Ranon beach, you will either walk for about 50 minutes (or catch a 20 minute truck transfer) through the stunning tropical forest high into the hills where people from fanla village will demonstrate for you the famous rom dances - traditionally performed only on very special occasions.

The Rom or 'Masked' dance is a sacred event associated with magic and it is believed to influence harvests. You will get an opportunity to watch a full schedule of hypnotic costumed dances as well as listen to beautiful and haunting bamboo flute music. You will also witness a small display of mysterious 'Black Magic' only performed by special sorcerers – 'the man blong blak majik'.


