Exhibition at Signal Point Experience Centre

In July 2021, Alexandrina Council received grant funding from the Australian Government under the Murray-Darling Basin Economic Development Program (Round 3) to create an immersive and regionally significant exhibition at the Signal Point Experience Centre, located at the Goolwa Wharf Precinct. The focus of this exhibition is Ngarrindjeri history and living culture, colonial heritage, and education focussing on the importance of river health.

During an 18-month process of co-design with the Ngarrindjeri Aboriginal Corporation, local community leaders and Exhibition Studios, Yuntulun Ku:li-war (coming together on the headland) was created and installed within the refurbished iconic Signal Point building.

In this exhibition by Fleurieu-based artists Melanie Fulton, Samuel Mulcahy and Betty Smart, the drawn, painted and sculpted plants and flowers, terrestrial and ocean based, real and imagined, are gathered together to create bountiful offerings of botanical artworks.

The artists all have various long associations working with plants and flowers in life as well as in art, through domestic gardening; flower growing on a commercial scale; tending the natural environment; working in the floristry industry; and through collecting and identifying specimens for the State Herbarium of South Australia.

These experiences have informed and enriched each artists' love of plants and flowers, as reflected in their paintings and sculptures.

Visitors to the exhibition can expect to see works of art utilising weaving, painting, textiles and fibre work, large-scale installation, and jewellery.


