ENTRY FORMS LODGEMENT—Entries can be lodged by:-

1. SHOW BOXES AT BUSINESS OUTLETS:- Seal entry form and correct entry fee in an envelope and place in the Show Boxes at one of the above outlets.

Entries not in envelopes and containing the correct entry fee may not be accepted at the business outlets. Please ensure you read all conditions of entry and sign the entry form to confirm you have read and understood the conditions of entry.

2. POSTING ENTRIES:- Completed entry forms can be posted to the Charters Towers Show Society, PO Box 141, Charters Towers, Qld. 4820. Envelopes must be postmarked no later than 19th July. Reminder—the mail can now take 1 week to arrive.

3. DROPPING TO SHOW OFFICE:- Completed entry forms can be dropped to the Charters Towers Show Society office located under the Grandstand on each week day during July up until Friday 19th July 2019. Office will be open during business hours.

4. ENTRIES ALSO ACCEPTED IN TOWN PLAZA OUTSIDE WOOLWORTHS:

When: Monday 15th July 2019 to Friday 19th July 2019

Time: 9.00am and 1.00pm each day.

Entries Close: Friday 19th July 2019 at 5.00pm

No Late Entries will be accepted under any circumstances.

EXHIBITS WILL NOT be accepted on these days.

Can also be collected from the Show Office from Monday 22nd July, 2019 during business hours.

Exhibit cards must be attached to all exhibits before being delivered to Stewards in the Halls.

Exhibitors Identification number will be written on the back of all exhibit cards for easier and quicker identification by Stewards when distributing items at the end of the Show. This number will not mean anything to the judges or anyone else.

GUIDELINES FOR ENTERING IN THE PAVILIONS

EXHIBITS ENTRY TIMES;

Exhibits will be accepted for judging for all sections in this schedule, **EXCEPT Cooking in Wallace James Hall and Childrens Section in Sallatina Hall on Friday 26th July between 11am & 4pm. Cooking exhibits in Wallace James Hall will be accepted on Sunday 28th July from 7:30-9.30am Childrens' Section in Sallatina Hall will be accepted on Sunday 28th July from 7am to 9am.**

EXHIBITS ACCESS; Entry into areas where items are exhibited is strictly prohibited.

Please see a Chief Steward or Halls Co-ordinator if you wish to gain access to an item on display.

Halls will open to the public for viewing of prizes and exhibits on Monday 29th July 2019 at 8.00am. There will be no public access to the halls on Sunday 28th July.

POINTS AND RESULTS

Aggregate prize points in each section will be awarded:- 1st—2 points, 2nd—1 point, Champion—3 points.

No results will be given over the telephone or via email.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Each exhibit must be the sole work of the exhibitor and presented in a clean and unused condition.

Please carefully select the classes into which your exhibits are to be entered. Once entered, they cannot be changed by you, a parent or a guardian. Only the Pavilions co-ordinators and Chief Stewards have the ability to add to, delete from, or divide classes in this schedule.

COLLECTION OF EXHIBITS AND PRIZE MONEY in Wallace James Hall:

Wednesday 31st July between 1:00pm and 5:00pm

1. Proceed to the Steward's table and tell them your name and the section you entered. You will be given your entry form to take to the collection area.

2. At the collection area hand the Steward your entry form to collect your relevant exhibits.

Stewards will check off your items against your entry form.

3. Once you have collected your exhibits proceed to the office under the grantstand. Prizes will be paid out according to the values in the Schedule. Exhibitors will be asked to sign entry form at the bottom and leave this form with the Stewards.

If you cannot collect your prize/s, please advise a Hall Steward—written authorisation for another person to pick your prizes up will be required.

Alternative arrangements for prize collection can be made by contacting the Show Secretary on 4787 7292 or Mobile 0438 759 125. All prizes uncollected within one week after judging without a valid reason, will be forfeited to the Charters Towers Show Society.

UNCOLLECTED PRIZES AND EXHIBITS

If you cannot make it to the Wallace James Hall on the Wednesday after the Show to collect your exhibits or prizes, please telephone the Hall Co-ordinator (0428 513 234) to make alternative arrangements for collection or organize some-one else to do so with written authority. Prize money, exhibits, rosettes and trophies not collected within one week of the show will become the property of the Charters Towers Show Society.

JUDGING AND CLASS CHANGES

It is a condition of entry into these classes and competitions that the judge's decision is final. No discussion will be entered into as to the merits of the winning exhibit or the quality of other exhibits. The Stewards reserve the right to change, delete or combine classes should there not be enough competitors.

THE HALLS ARE CLOSED TO THE PUBLIC DURING JUDGING—NO EXCEPTIONS!

WAIVER AND DISCLAIMER:

TPAMA Inc. (The Charters Towers Show) is a member of the QCAS. All entries are therefore

accepted subject to the rules, regulations and by-laws of the QCAS and any rules or regulations imposed by TPAMA.

The Charters Towers Show Society cannot take any responsibility for any misplaced, lost, altered, damaged or stolen exhibits given into the care and control of Stewards or Officials of the Charters Towers Show Society. It is a condition of entry into this Show and competitions that the exhibitor will hold the Association blameless and indemnified against any legal proceedings for any action or omission for accidents; injuries; loss of property, income or prize money, alteration to exhibits, wrong advice or decisions; theft; mishandling of an exhibit; incorrect attribution; defamation; non delivery or wrong delivery of exhibits. If an exhibitor is not sure of this condition of Entry and Exhibiting, then they should seek their own legal advice at their own expense, prior to entering the competition.

DISPUTE RESOLUTION

Anyone objecting to an award or to an exhibit in these competitions can enter a protest. This protest must be in writing and set out the grounds for objection. The objection must then be lodged with the Secretary before noon on Tuesday before the end of the Show. All protests must be accompanied by reasons for the protest and a \$50 deposit. The objection will be considered by the Dispute Resolution Committee (DRC) made up of the Charters Towers Show President, the Charters Towers Show Secretary and one (1) Charters Towers Show Executive Management Committee member. The DRC will make enquiries and report back to the parties with a decision and reasons for the decision. If the Committee finds the protest frivolous or vexatious, then it can order the \$50 forfeited and put towards next year's Show prizes. The Committee's decision is final.

PRIVACY

As a condition of entry, you authorize the collection of personal information such as name, address and contact details for the purpose of running the Show. This information will not be provided to third parties unless required in accordance with the Charters Towers Show Society Privacy Policy.

ILLEGAL ITEMS

As a condition of the Show, the Stewards and Charters Towers Secretary have the right to refuse the entry of illegal or banned items being exhibited in the Charters Towers Show. The list of banned items is in the QCAS list and it includes things such as a drug referenced items and laser pointers etc. A full list is available for view at the Charters Towers Show Office or it can be faxed to you.
