### **BUSH AND BAY TOUR (DEEP CREEK EXPERIENCES & BIG DUCK TOURS)**

Start your day with pick-up directly from your accommodation by <u>Deep Creek Experiences</u> expert guide for a half - day adventure

#### THE BIG DUCK BOAT - SEA WIRRINA TOUR

Head to Wirrina Wharf and enjoy a 70-minute boat tour with <u>The Big Duck Tours</u> which travels up the coast to Rapid Bay passing Second Valley. Spot seals, dolphins, and seasonal whales on this thrilling marine adventure, whilst discovering the history of Rapid Bay and enjoy its dramatic cliffs, rocky shores and secret beaches.

#### **DEEP CREEK NATIONAL PARK**

Enjoy a 4WD to picture postcard parts of <u>Deep Creek National Park</u>, learning about native flora, fauna, and bush foods, with breathtaking views of Kangaroo Island and the Pages Islands.

### AFTERNOON

#### **INGALALLA FALLS WALK**

After arriving back to Sunset Retreat on Birkdale freshen up, and hit the road for a nature excursion to Ingalalla Falls just 10 minutes down on Hay Flat Road. The locals like to claim this attraction as one of their own due to its proximity to Normanville. Best time to see the Ingalalla Water Falls in action is late autumn to late spring, but the water flows all year round.

### THE GREAT "BIG" GORGE WALK SELF-GUIDED EXPERIENCE

Start from Garnet Kelly Reserve, opposite 6790 Main South Rd, Normanville. This 3.6km return walk runs adjacent to the Yankalilla River, on the route of the historic coach road, and the path Colonel William Light walked during his first surveys. Enjoy the magnificent scenery, interactive signposts and the site of the first unofficial hotel.

### **HMAS HOBART LOOKOUT**

The <u>HMAS Hobart Lookout</u> is only 4 minutes up the road from Big Gorge, and is a lasting memorial to the ship and its crew. Scuttled on 5 November at Yankalilla Bay, the anchor now points from the lookout to what is now a premier eco-tourism dive site and marine reserve.



### **MORNING: (INCLUDING BREAKFAST)**

### **CAFFE ON BUNGALA BREAKFAST**

Enjoy a big breakfast and a perfectly crafted coffee at Caffe on Bungala. There's lots of options for the kids and our personal favourite is the breakfast salad. Relax into the rhythm of the street – sipping coffee on the footpath. Locals linger, visitors soak it in, as Normanville awakes. Alternately you can book into One Little Sister which does all day breakfasts.

### HERITAGE TRAIL FROM BUNGALA HOUSE

Begin your journey by picking up a Bike at the Fleurieu Coast Visitors Centre and riding to Bungala House. See Fergusson's Mill, The Court House and Mary MacKillop school house the historic St Peter's Church finishing in the beautiful Bungala Park. While doing the heritage trail, call in to Lot 50 for a coffee and cake, the kids can call in to the Lolly Shop or fossick for treasure at the legendary Yankalilla Community Op Shop, Club Fleurieu Op Shop, Yankalilla Trading Shop and <u>Yankalilla Second hand & Book Exchange</u>. Alternately join Elise from Enliven Outdoor Adventures for a beach cruise to Carrickalinga and return on their retro bikes.

### LUNCH

### LUNCH AT A BLOOM & BREW

Stop by one of Normanville's charming cafés for a light lunch, enjoying freshly brewed coffee, smashing smoothies, main meals, sandwiches, or salads. Additionally, the <u>Normanville Hotel</u> is always open for a traditional pub lunch in a historic setting or grab some takeaway fish & chips to enjoy at the beach from the Agua Blue Normanville Kiosk or Fast Eddies Normanville.

### **AFTERNOON**

### NORMANVILLE FORESHORE

Take a final stroll along Normanville Beach, soaking in the serene coastal atmosphere one more time before embarking on the short trip back to Adelaide.

### **GIN TASTING AT FLEURIEU GIN**

Wrap up your trip with a visit to Fleurieu Gin, where you can savour a guided tasting of their handcrafted gins, discover the history of the land, test your swing at the paddock tee-off or challenge your family on the putt-putt green and the driving range. The kids can enjoy mocktails and lawn games with plenty of space to play. If craft beer is more your style, nearby Forktree Brewing's bar and restaurant boasts outstanding views over Carrickalinga, with Kangaroo Island peeking over the horizon on a clear day.
