

Some of the State's best ocean and rural views can be found at Cape Jervis. This little town is the mainland port for the Sealink and Kangaroo Island Connect ferries and the beginning of the beautiful and challenging Heysen Trail. Be sure to stop at the lookout before the ferry terminal and enjoy the panorama. Nearby the lighthouse can be viewed. Deep Creek and Talisker Conservation Park are close

Cape Fishing Charters offer half-day (Mon-Fri) and full-day(s) fishing charters (7 days), sightseeing, bird watching, photographic tours, marine services, passenger transport and many other water experiences. Contact the team on 0409 691 846, and they'll deliver.

Fishery Beach is a popular fishing beach that was home to a whaling station in the 1840s/1850s and some ruins remain. In 1862 it became a shipping port for the export of ore from the nearby Talisker Mine. On clear days Kangaroo Island can be seen. This is also the point where the submarine cable leaves the mainland and feeds power along the seabed to the Dudley Peninsula on Kangaroo Island.

Fishing Charters are available departing from Cape Jervis and Wirrina Cove. Ask at the Visitor Centre for a list of operators. Morgans Beach is a popular fishing and swimming cove with steep

sand hills that are a favourite of children. **The port area** is the base for Sealink ferry and Kangaroo Island Connect services. There is a boat ramp for launching boats and fishing is popular.

You can also see the lighthouse here. Starfish Hill Wind Farm is located across two hills on the tip of the Fleurieu Peninsula near Cape Jervis. It is the first wind farm built in South Australia. There are 23 wind turbines with 15 located on Salt Creek Hill and eight on Star Fish Hill. Each of the turbines has three blades with a tower height of 68 metres and overall height of 100 metres from the ground to the blade tip. It provides enough Energy to meet the needs f about 18 000 households (ie. 2% of the State's residential customers and adds 1% to the available generation capacity in South Australia.

Nestled amongst farmland, high above the Fleurieu Coast you will find Parawa. This little town commands 360° views across the Peninsula and is one of South Australia's highest rainfall areas.

Rapid Bay E5

Rapid Bay is the place where Colonel Light first stepped ashore in South Australia from his ship The Rapid. Nestled between a long sandy beach and towering cliffs, the limestone mining which once dominated the bay has now been superseded by a modern jetty and is a popular fishing, diving and camping spot.

ATTRACTIONS

Rapid Bay Beach is popular for swimming, jetty fishing, scuba diving and snorkelling. The waters surrounding the jetty are home to the elusive and endangered Leafy Seadragon.

Rapid Bay Campground is a beachfront camping area. Please note, no hot showers or power available. (08) 8598 0240 or visitfleurieucoast.com.au. **Snorkelling and Diving** Rapid Bay jetty dive is often described as the best jetty dive in Australia. Divers can expect to see a large range of fish and marine life including the Leafy Seadragon. Rapid Bay Head is home to a number of reefs and caves, and interesting marine life and sea grasses. Rapid Bay Head can be reached by boat and tours.

Second Valley ES

Second Valley can be found just off Main South Road, between Rapid Bay (E5) and Normanville (G3). The extraordinary coastline has steep hills and sheer cliffs, with stretches of pebble beach and gorgeous little sandy coves. Fishing is popular from the rocks and the jetty. It is also a good spot for swimming. A walk along the path from the jetty will reveal the intensely folded rock strata which was buckled and moulded into this spectacular formation millions of years ago.

Second Valley Beach is one of the most photographed beaches along the Fleurieu Coast. With stunning views of the coastline and unique geological formations it is popular for swimming, jetty fishing, snorkelling and scuba diving.

Second Valley Playground 5 Finniss Vale Drive. A fun little playground for the kids.



The pretty Bungala River flows through the township of Yankalilla. It is one of the larger towns but has retained its old village atmosphere. Take a walk along the tree-lined streets of the town to admire the rural architecture and many cottage gardens. Since 1994, the Shrine of Our Lady of Yankalilla has attracted tens of thousands of pilgrims to the town, along with journalists and documentary makers. Yankalilla is also home to a number of art, craft and bric-a-brac stores, and the first country Josephite school opened by Saint Mary MacKillop in 1867.



Bungala House Country Estate 34 Main Road Bungala House began in the 1860s with the Butterworth brothers, millers, and grain exporters. Extensions by the Graham family created a grand house of 14 rooms, plus gardens and croquet lawn; it was the district's social centre. Today, it is a family home, offering unique luxury accommodation including breakfast, with an outdoor swimming pool, that is a relaxing retreat or an ideal wedding or function venue.
