A Kununurra Snapshot

Perfect for travellers short on time, this three day itinerary captures the essence of Kununurra and introduces visitors to the landscapes, waterways and stories that make the East Kimberley so special.

Day 1 - Discover Kununurra

Start your East Kimberley adventure at the Kununurra Visitor Centre where local experts can provide maps, insider tips and help arrange tours.

Spend the morning exploring the heart of Kununurra township. Browse the town's distinctive art galleries, showcasing contemporary Aboriginal artworks from across the Kimberley, or visit the diamond showrooms to see the famous Argyle pink diamonds and other unique jewellery pieces.

History lovers should make time for the Kununurra Historical Society Museum, where photographs, artefacts and stories bring the pioneering days of the Ord River Scheme and early settlement to life.


In the afternoon head to Mirima National Park, often called the mini Bungle Bungles. Located just minutes from town, the park features striking sandstone formations and a series of short walking trails.

The wheelchair-friendly boardwalk provides an accessible way to experience the dramatic landscapes. Later, take a scenic drive through the Ord River Irrigation Area.

Start at Ivanhoe Crossing, a popular local fishing and photo spot, before continuing along Research Station Road and Weaber Plains Road through rich agricultural country.

Finish the day at Kelly's Knob Lookout, the highest point in Kununurra, where sunset views stretch across the Ord River, Lake Kununurra and the rugged ranges beyond.

Day 2 – Ord River & Lake Argyle Adventure

Today experience the remarkable waterways that shape the East Kimberley.

Join a combined cruise along the Upper Ord River and Lake Argyle, one of the region's signature experiences. Cruise through peaceful river channels framed by ancient cliffs and lush vegetation while keeping watch for wildlife including freshwater crocodiles, wallabies and colourful birdlife such as kingfishers and eagles.

The cruise connects with Lake Argyle, Australia's largest freshwater lake. Here you can take a leisurely boat cruise across the vast expanse of water and even enjoy a refreshing swim.

During the visit you'll also stop at the Argyle Homestead Museum, where the original homestead was relocated stone by stone after the dam was constructed.

Return to Kununurra in the late afternoon after a day surrounded by spectacular scenery and unique wildlife.

Day 3 – The Bungle Bungles from above

No trip to the East Kimberley is complete without experiencing Purnululu National Park, home of the iconic Bungle Bungle Range.

From Kununurra, several scenic flights operate daily using fixed-wing aircraft or helicopters. Flying over this World Heritage listed landscape reveals the extraordinary beehive-shaped domes, hidden gorges and sweeping wilderness that make Purnululu one of Australia's most extraordinary natural wonders.

Aerial views also showcase other remote landscapes of the East Kimberley including the Ord River, Lake Argyle and the rugged ranges that dominate the region.

Return to Kununurra after an unforgettable morning and enjoy a relaxed lunch before continuing your Kimberley journey.

The Best of Kununurra

Days 1, 2 and 3

With five days to explore, visitors can discover Kununurra's iconic waterways, experience the surrounding landscapes and venture further into the East Kimberley.

Day 1 - Arrive in Kununurra

Arrive in Kununurra and settle into your accommodation before heading to the Kununurra Visitor Centre to plan the days ahead.

Spend the afternoon wandering the township. Browse local art galleries, discover unique jewellery inspired by Argyle diamonds and visit the Kununurra Historical Society Museum to learn about the Ord River Scheme and the pioneering spirit that built the town.

Finish the day watching the sunset from Kelly's Knob Lookout followed by dinner overlooking the Ord River

Day 2 - Mirima & the Ord Irrigation Area

Begin the morning with a walk in Mirima National Park, where the distinctive sandstone formations create a miniature version of the Bungle Bungle landscape.

Later, explore the Ord River Irrigation Area, one of Australia's most significant agricultural projects.

Drive past fertile farmland growing crops such as sandalwood, melons, pumpkins and cotton. Stop by Ivanhoe Crossing, a favourite fishing spot for locals and an iconic Kimberley photo opportunity.

Day 3 - Ord River Cruise & Lake Argyle

Today experience one of the Kimberley's most spectacular waterways.

Join a full-day Ord River cruise travelling from Lake Kununurra upstream to Lake Argyle. The journey passes towering cliffs, lily-covered lagoons and abundant wildlife including freshwater crocodiles, rock wallabies and hundreds of bird species.

Arriving at Lake Argyle, enjoy a cruise across the immense freshwater lake and visit the Argyle Homestead Museum before returning to Kununurra.

The Best of Kununurra

Days 4 and 5



Get your El Questro Pass, at Kununurra Visitor Centre.

Day 4 – El Questro & the Gibb River Road

Take a day trip along part of the legendary Gibb River Road to El Questro Wilderness Park, around 100 km from Kununurra.

Along the way enjoy spectacular views of the rugged Cockburn Range, one of the most photographed landscapes in the Kimberley.

At El Questro explore some of the park's highlights including:

- Emma Gorge, a scenic walk leading to a cool swimming hole
- Zebedee Springs, a series of warm thermal pools shaded by palms
- El Questro Gorge, a dramatic gorge with permanent waterholes

Return to Kununurra in the late afternoon.

Day 5 – Wyndham & Five Rivers Lookout

Take a scenic drive to the historic port town of Wyndham, just an hour north of Kununurra.

Explore local attractions including:

- Five Rivers Lookout – where the Ord, Pentecost, King, Durack and Forrest Rivers meet
- The Grotto – a natural waterhole surrounded by towering cliffs
- Marlgu Billabong – great for birdwatching
- Wyndham's historic port and jetty


Before returning to Kununurra, visit the famous Prison Boab Tree along King River Road, an iconic Kimberley landmark believed to have been used as a holding site during the pastoral era.

Day 1 - Arrival in Kununurra

Arrive in Kununurra and visit the Kununurra Visitor Centre for maps, local knowledge and tour bookings.

Spend the afternoon exploring the township's art galleries, boutique stores and cafés before watching sunset from Kelly's Knob Lookout.

Day 2 - Mirima National Park & Ord Irrigation Area

Explore Mirima National Park, known as the mini Bungle Bungles. Walk the scenic trails among the striking sandstone formations before discovering the agricultural heart of the region on a drive through the Ord River Irrigation Area.

Day 3 - Lake Argyle

Take a scenic drive to Lake Argyle, Australia's largest freshwater lake.

Visit the Argyle Homestead Museum, swim in the famous infinity pool at Lake Argyle Resort or hire a BBQ boat and cruise across the tranquil waters surrounded by rugged hills and islands.

Day 4 - Ord River Cruise

Experience the incredible wildlife and landscapes of the Upper Ord River on a scenic cruise between Lake Argyle and Kununurra.

Look out for freshwater crocodiles, wallabies and colourful birdlife as you travel through one of the most picturesque waterways in northern Australia.

Walk to Emma Gorge, soak in the warm pools of Zebedee Springs and experience the rugged beauty of the Kimberley landscape.

Day 6 - Wyndham Day Trip

Drive to Wyndham, the northernmost town in Western Australia.

Visit the spectacular Five Rivers Lookout, explore the town's historic port and discover natural attractions such as The Grotto and Marlgu Billabong.


Day 7 - Bungle Bungle Experience

End your Kimberley adventure with a scenic flight over Purnululu National Park.

From the air you'll see the extraordinary beehive domes of the Bungle Bungle Range, deep gorges and remote wilderness areas rarely seen from the ground.

Why not make it a day trip with a ground tour and/or helicopter flight - or even extend and stay the night.

With ten days to explore, visitors can immerse themselves in the landscapes, culture and adventure that define the East Kimberley.

Day 1 - Arrive in Kununurra

Arrive in Kununurra and visit the Kununurra Visitor Centre before exploring the township's galleries, cafés and shops.

Day 2 - Mirima National Park and Ord River Cruise

Walk the trails of Mirima National Park and enjoy sunset views from Kellys Knob Lookout.

Take in an Ord River Cruise - cruising along the Upper ORd River, spotting wildlife and learning about the natural and cultural history of the region.

Day 3 - Ord River Irrigation Area

Take a self-drive tour through the Ord River Irrigation Area, visiting Ivanhoe Crossing and learning about the region's remarkable agricultural transformation. Or take part in an organised tour with a local.

Day 4 - Lake Argyle

Travel to Lake Argyle and enjoy a cruise or swim in the infinity pool overlooking the lake's vast waters.

Day 5 - Bungle Bungles Experience

Day 7 – Wyndham

Visit the historic town of Wyndham and take in the sweeping views from Five Rivers Lookout.

Be sure to visit the Wyndham Arts Hub and Wyndham Museum.

Day 8 – Mitchell Falls Scenic Flight

Take an unforgettable scenic flight to the remote Mitchell Falls in Mitchell River National Park.

Fly over the dramatic Kimberley coastline before landing to explore the spectacular tiered waterfalls. Visitors can hike to the falls or take a helicopter transfer for aerial views of the cascades.

Day 9 – Fishing the waterways

Join a guided fishing tour on one of the many waterways in the region, where anglers can try their luck catching the famous Barramundi.

The rivers are also home to saltwater crocodiles and an incredible variety of birdlife.

For a unique experience, consider a cultural fishing tour with Traditional Owners, learning about fishing practices and cultural connections to Country.

Day 10 – Culture, Rum & Local Flavours

Spend your final day discovering the cultural heart of the region.

Visit Waringarri Aboriginal Arts to see local artists at work and learn about Miriwoong culture.

Join a sunset cultural tour in Mirima National Park, guided by Traditional Owners who share stories of Country.

Before leaving town, stop at The Hoochery Distillery, Western Australia's oldest continuously operating rum distillery, to taste the famous Ord River Rum.

Finish your journey by picking up a special Kimberley souvenir — perhaps even a rare Argyle pink diamond.
