GETTING THERE

CAR

From Pinjarra Road turn down Lakes Road towards the hospital, continue past the hospital about 2kms to Bedingfield Road. Turn Right onto Koolyanga Place and follow the road around to the river. Carpark entrance is on Wanda Road.

BUS

CYCLING

Cycle paths are available along Pinjarra Road. Turn left onto Old Pinjarra Road, then left onto Teranca Road, then right onto Manjeep Road and right onto Wanda Road. Approximately 3kms from Pinjarra Road.

Please take care crossing roads and obey the traffic signals along Pinjarra Road.

TRAIL INFO

The Riverside Heartwalk trail follows the Serpentine River, with a boardwalk that leads out to the water and spectacular views. This walk is perfect for any fitness level and a great walk to do with family and friends. Make sure you take your camera to capture the abundant flora and fauna.

The best time of year to explore the Riverside Heartwalk is late autumn to mid-spring, when the temperatures are cooler. Spring is a peak walking period because of the spectacular wildflower displays.

The distance is 2km one way and takes about 90mins, wear comfortable footwear and take plenty of water, a hat, sunscreen and a light jacket just in case the weather changes.

There are many sheltered picnic areas along the trail, perfect for taking a break, refuel and take in the fresh air and surroundings.

BBQ facilities are available. Please either take your rubbish with you or use the bins provided.

POINTS OF INTEREST

Start your walk from the boat ramp and follow the limestone track along the river, around the loop and back to the carpark. On the return leg you can turn left at either boardwalk and return via the path. This way you can take advantage of every turn the boardwalk offers.

Along the trail you might see boats on the water, fishing for local black bream, or just taking in the river sites. You might even be lucky enough to see some of the local dolphins frolicking in the water.

Often your main companions on the trail are the wildlife - Pelicans, Herons and other wetland birds.

There are many seating areas offered along the walk, which is idyllic for resting, bird watching or just taking in the views.
