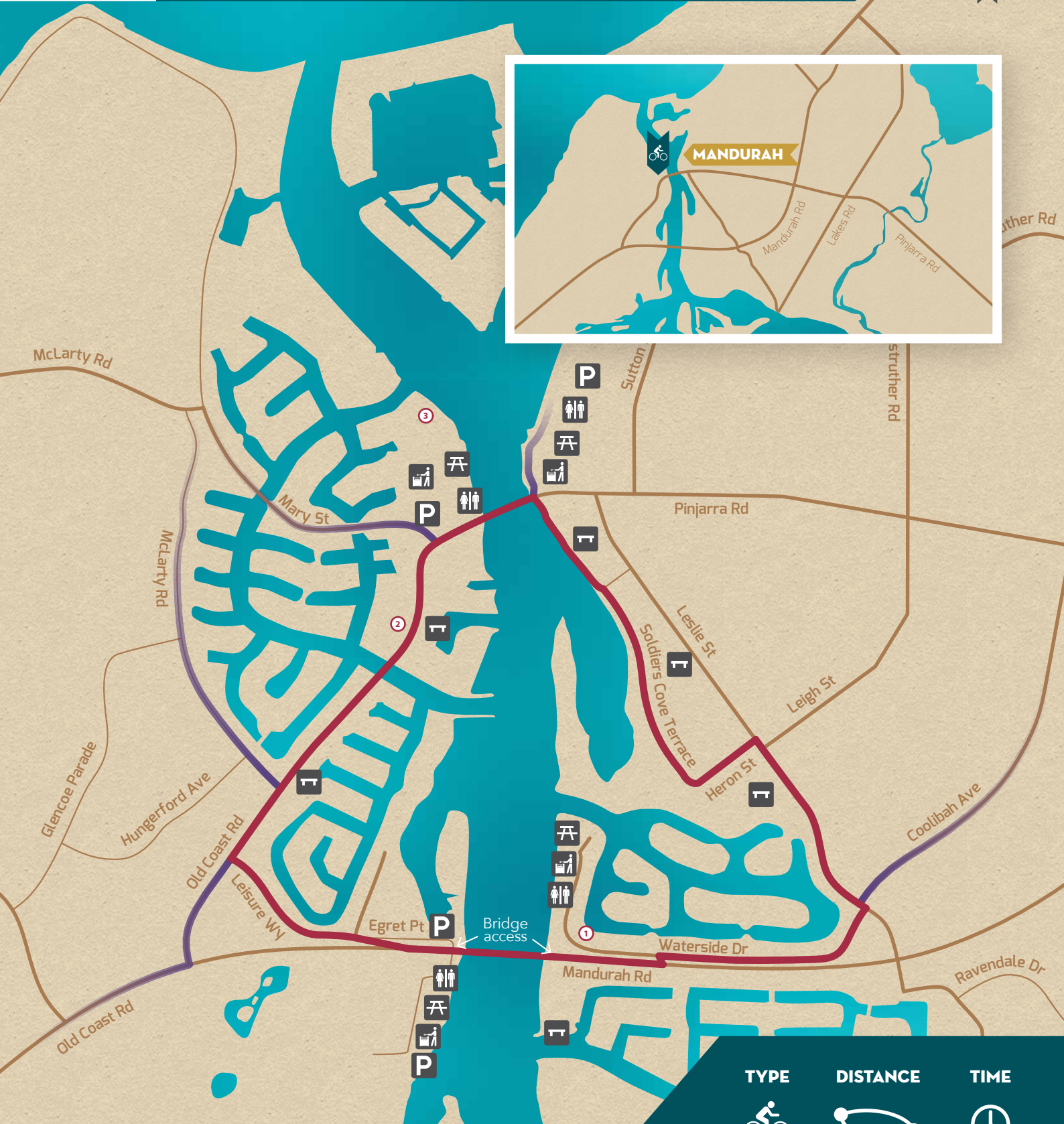




BRIDGES RIDE

GETTING THERE

CAR

Park your car and begin your journey by parking at the following car parks available.

- Eastern Foreshore carpark - Mandurah Terrace, Mandurah
- Hall Park carpark - Mary Street, Mandurah
(Note that you will need to walk your bike over the bridge)
- Waterside Drive carpark - Leslie Street, Mandurah

BRIDGE

There are two access points for the footpath under the Mandurah bypass bridge located at Egret Point and one on Westview Drive.

1. SAMPHIRE WETLANDS

Samphire Cove Nature Reserve is located on the north-western side of the Peel Inlet, on the north-west of the Mandurah Bypass Bridge on Egret Point.

Whether you are interested in birds, wildlife. Mandurah's samphire wetlands are a fascinating and enjoyable environment to explore.

At Samphire Cove Nature Reserve, boardwalks, viewing platforms and information panels have been provided by Cedar Woods Properties Ltd to help you understand and enjoy the changing estuarine environment.

2. SUTTON FARM

Following the pathways along Old Coast road you will pass the historic Sutton Farm.

Sutton Farm is a heritage-listed place dating from the 1860's comprising a homestead building, single men's quarters and barn as well as significant trees on a 1.4 hectare site at Apollo Place, Halls Head.

In 1840, the Sutton Family purchased the land and was used to open a small inn (the Wayside Inn) which was used by mail coaches for overnight stops. Around this time, John Sutton applied for a ferry license to transport people, horses and carts across the estuary.

After the passing of John Sutton, his wife Eleanor Sutton was left with the difficult job of managing the farm, inn and ferry service. Her nephew Henry Sutton came over from Ireland in 1862 to help with the farm. Unfortunately Eleanor passed away in 1868 leaving the farm to her nephew.

3. HALL PARK WAR MEMORIAL

As you cross at the intersection of Old Mandurah road and Mary Street you come to a path which leads to the Mandurah War Memorial located on the northern point of Hall Park.

The War memorial design uses large white pillars of various heights straddling a small rise with the axis of the row lying along the line of the Sun's rays as it rises on Anzac day.

The Memorial is a communal space that can be used throughout the year as place of gathering, education and relaxation in addition to its primary role as a place of remembrance and reflection.

Ablution facilities are available at Hall Park and plenty of grassed areas to rest and relax or why not pack a picnic and eat under a sheltered table overlooking the Mandurah Estuary.

CODE OF PRACTICE

- Remember to wear your helmet. Suitable footwear will help protect your feet from hard concrete pathways and on hot summer days.
- Check your bike. Before you start out ensure your brakes, bell and lights are working. It's better to be safe than sorry.
- Look out for others. Ring your bell when approaching pedestrians, they may not always see or hear you coming.
- Keep Left and ride in single file.
- Watch out for traffic, especially when the path crosses a road.
- Remember to indicated when turning or stopping.
