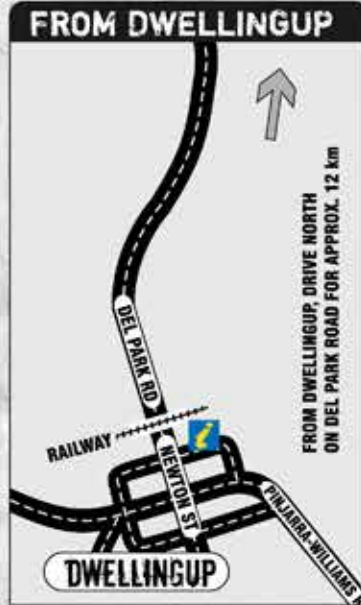

THE TRAIL

A very popular, intermediate trail with numerous steep sections and lots of harder obstacles. In addition to the 11 km main loop, there is a 5 km shortcut, as well as a 1.1 km easy-rated (Green) kids' loop.

GETTING THERE

From Dwellingup Visitor Centre, turn right at the hotel into Del Park Road.

Follow Del Park Road for 4 km, then turn left into North Spur Road.

Travel along North Spur Road for 5 km, then turn right into Kesners Road.

Follow Kesners Road for approximately 1 km until you see the signs for Turner Hill Mountain Bike Trail.

FACILITIES

At the trail start: camp site, toilets and car parking. This is a remote area with no mobile phone reception.

Food and drinks: The nearby town of Dwellingup has many options including good cafes, restaurants, food stores and takeaways.

SIDE-TRACKED

Dwellingup is located within the beautiful Darling Range State Forest and nestled between the South Dandalup and Murray Rivers.

Adjacent to the Bibbulmun Track and the Munda Biddi Trail, as well as the natural beauty of Lane Poole reserve, Dwellingup offers wonderful opportunities to relax, unwind and explore.

The town is also home to the Dwellingup History and Visitor Information Centre, which houses a fascinating local history museum and fully restored, vintage Mack Fire Truck.

The Hotham Valley Railway runs a regular tourist train service from Dwellingup (vintage diesel in summer and steam in winter).

There is also a vibrant selection of local arts and crafts shops, a fruit wine and cidery, and a delightful tree top walk at the nearby Forest Heritage Centre.

MUNDA BIDDI

The Munda Biddi is an off-road cycle touring route that stretches 1000 km from Mundaring to Albany, with campsites along the way.

Dwellingup is the first town that the trail passes through after leaving Mundaring, making it a popular stop off destination.

MOUNTAIN BIKE CODE OF PRACTICE

Plan ahead:

- Be sure that you have read the trail information before you set out.
- Carry adequate food, water and spare parts.
- Leave no trace. Take all your rubbish home.

Ride safely:

- Wear a helmet and suitable clothing.
- Ride to the conditions of the trail.
- Ride within your ability and always ride at a safe speed.

Ride with respect:

- Stay on the trail, and avoid sensitive natural areas.
- Avoid excessive braking and skidding to minimise trail widening and erosion.
- Practice low impact riding. Do not take short cuts or form new trails, and avoid riding in wet, muddy conditions.
- Keep your tyres clean to help prevent the spread of dieback disease, the root-rot fungus that is killing our native plants.

Share the trail:

- Be courteous to other trail users.
- Keep left wherever possible.
- Slow to approach others and pass with care.
